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**Members retired by board; ineligible for re-employment.**

Sec. 145.32 (486-59). On and after September 30, 1951, any member, who has \*\*\* passed his sixtieth birthday and has five or more years of total service credit, or has completed thirty-six or more years of total service may retire by filing with the public employees retirement board an application for retirement. The filing of such application shall retire such member as of the end of the month then current, providing his public service has terminated by that date.

\*\*\* Prior to June 30, 1955, an employer may, as of the thirtieth day of June of any year, terminate the employment of any member who has attained the age of seventy, or who will attain the age of seventy by the following thirty-first day of December. Any such employee whose employment is not so terminated shall be required to present a certification prior to the thirtieth day of June of each year by a physician licensed to practice in the state of Ohio, which physician is mutually acceptable to the employee and his employer, that the member is physically and mentally competent to perform the duties of the particular position which he occupies \*\*\*. Any member who accepts an allowance under section 145.32, 145.33, or 145.34 of the Revised Code, or who on or after October 31, 1953, is compelled to retire and who withdraws his accumulated contributions in lieu of accepting a retirement allowance is ineligible for regular re-employment in any capacity which comes within sections 145.01 to 145.57, inclusive, of the Revised Code.

A member may at the time of retirement by written designation duly executed and filed with the board designate a beneficiary to receive any in-

stallment which may remain unpaid at the time of his death. After the date of retirement such nomination shall not be changed if the member elects to receive his allowance computed as Option 1 or Option 2, provided in section 145.46 of the Revised Code.
